## **Who are Midlands4Cities?**

The AHRC-funded [Midlands4Cities Doctoral Training Partnership](#) (M4C) brings together eight leading universities across the Midlands to support the professional and personal development of the next generation of arts and humanities doctoral researchers. M4C is a collaboration between the University of Birmingham, Birmingham City University, University of Warwick, Coventry University, University of Leicester, De Montfort University, Nottingham Trent University and The University of Nottingham.

Through their Open Doctoral and Collaborative Doctoral Awards Midlands4Cities will fund and support outstanding research for 86 doctoral researchers across the breadth of Arts and Humanities starting in October 2024. There are 70 PhD studentships available through an open competition and M4C is also awarding 16 Collaborative Doctoral Awards (CDA) which provide diverse and unique project opportunities with national, regional, and local partner organisations. UK, EU, and international applicants are eligible for both routes for 2024 entry. Further details on the funding provided are available on the [M4C website here](#).



## **What is a Collaborative Doctoral Award?**

These awards are jointly developed and co-supervised between an M4C university and an external partner organisation. CDAs offer diverse and unique research projects that support the work of the partner organisation.

This CDA (PhD project) is between China Plate, University of Birmingham, and University of Warwick.

## **Where and when will the PhD be taking place?**

The PhD is predominantly located in and around Birmingham and the West Midlands region and can be undertaken on a full or part time basis, with a start date of October 2024.

China Plate is based in Birmingham and works across the UK. We have an office in Digbeth, Birmingham and Aldgate East, London - both of which have desks available for the researcher to use during their tenure. The researcher will be expected to work in-person as well as remotely, attending rehearsals, workshops, company team meetings etc.

There is also an expectation that the researcher travels in line with project activity and is present in some of the places that is happening but does not necessarily need to be based there. Due to the nature of theatre production schedules, we are unable to state where we



will be operating between 2024-2027. Work produced in 2022/23 has included Birmingham, Coventry, London, Northampton and Mainz in Germany.

## **Is the PhD funded?**

Yes, it is an AHRC-funded Midlands4Cities Collaborative Doctoral Award.

Awards for UK residents cover UK tuition fees and provide a stipend at the UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) rate – this year it is £18,622 per annum – this is a tax-free payment. There are also additional funding opportunities available for research expenses.

## Who will support the PhD candidate?

The researcher will be supported by Ed Collier, Co-Artistic Director of China Plate, and jointly supervised by Adam Ledger from the University of Birmingham and Bobby Smith from the University of Warwick, with project support from Shahnaz Akhter from the University of Warwick.

## What Training & Development opportunities are available as part of the PhD?

There will be opportunities to benefit from China Plate's training programmes, including [The Optimists](#) (annual ten-week training programme), [People Focused Producing](#) (year round training events) and [Young Producers](#) (co-curated training programme with young people at Warwick Arts Centre).

There are also additional funding opportunities available, which include a Research Development Fund (RDF) to support primary research activities, an Engagement Fund (EF) to enable students to undertake placements and other professional development activity and a Cohort Development Fund (CDF) which supports groups of M4C students to design training, development and research activities.

## **What qualifications do I need to be eligible to apply?**

There are four potential forms of eligible preparation that Midlands4Cities recognise – you can read about these in the guidance documents on their [website here](#).

## **Do Midlands4Cities have specific requirements to consider?**

Yes, before completing your application, you should read and understand the application notes and scoring criteria. You will need to refer to these during the application process.

## What is required as part of my application?

Things to note:

- You will need to create a Momentive account.
- The application does not need to be completed in one sitting, you can save and continue later.
- Part of the application asks Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) questions, all of which are voluntary and if you would rather not answer, you can choose 'prefer not to say' every time.
- You will need to nominate two referees.
- Your two referees will need to provide their references via the portal, and these must be submitted with your application before Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2024 at 12 noon (GMT).

At the same time as applying to M4C, candidates should apply to the University of Birmingham for PhD study, in order that a University of Birmingham applicant number can then be stated on the M4C application.
