Launched in 2006, China Plate is an independent theatre studio that collaborates with venues, festivals, and funders to develop, make and present engaging, entertaining and accessible new work. With the expertise gained from over 17 years of producing theatre, we collaborate, make and co-create with artists and communities, listening to their stories, looking for what is important to them and then working with them to build creative teams to realise their ideas. The theatre we make is adventurous and imaginative; it has popular appeal and a social purpose.

We take shows into theatres and community spaces, onto the streets and to festivals in the UK and internationally. This is supported by a suite of highly regarded development and producer training programmes designed to uncover and nurture ideas, develop skills and artistic practice, facilitate collaboration, commission work, increase access and widen diversity across scales.

Based in Birmingham, China Plate works nationally whilst having a particular focus on activity in the Midlands. We are Associate Producers at Warwick Arts Centre and operate a number of significant partnership and co-production models with theatres, funders and other producing companies across the UK.



WHAT IS THE OPTIMISTS?

China Plate's The Optimists offers an introduction to the craft of producing professional theatre and arts projects and demystifies the financial, administrative and organisational aspects of producing. Drawing on China Plate's extensive experience, the Optimists provides knowledge and insight into the practicalities of making, funding, touring and promoting work.

The course aims to nurture and develop those interested in making art happen – whether emerging producers, administrators, artists, creative practitioners or community champions. Using theatre producing as the vehicle, we hope to arm participants with the transferrable and entrepreneurial skills to make their ideas a reality.

The content can be tailored and adapted to the needs of an organisation/group. We will work collaboratively with an organisation to ensure the course is catered to the experience level of the cohort, as well as cover/expand upon areas of producing that are of particular interest.

We offer a safe space for each participant to learn, develop, and discuss topical areas; and provide support outside & and beyond the course.

WHAT DO WE BRING?

- Tried and tested course content that is constantly reviewed and updated based on changes in the sector
- Delivery from our producing team, providing first-hand skills and reflections from our own on-the-ground experience as theatre producers within the subsidised arts sector
- High calibre guest speakers in discussion with your needs and budget
- Tailored content/speakers specific to the group whether adjusted for:
 - Age/experience-level
 - Art form/context
 - Learning styles/access considerations
 - Any other that can be discussed with us

We would work in collaboration with a partner organisation to understand your priorities and your cohort to ensure the content is adjusted to meet these needs.

For example, in the past we have adapted The Optimists to be delivered with students at Universities and Drama Schools (University of Birmingham, East 15, Rose Bruford), theatre-makers enrolled in regional development programmes, for example, In Good Company; Derby Theatre; and a group of Assistant Producers as part of Shoot Festival.

We have a track record of successfully adjusting our training and artist development models to work in different contexts, such as within musical theatre, rural dance and when exploring co-creative practice:

IMPACT FOR PREVIOUS PARTICIPANTS

Participants gain:

- Support and career development
- Transferable skills in articulating and promoting a new piece of work, budget management, principles of fundraising, working with audiences and in partnership.
- Core skills and knowledge specific to their medium
- The opportunity to learn as part of a cohort in a safe environment

The Optimists alumni have gone to secure financial support, produce live events, theatre shows and programmes, to work freelance in the industry and for organisations, such as The Belgrade Theatre, Birmingham Hippodrome, and OPUS. Others have set up their own organisations, e.g. the co-founders of RE-CREATE Agency.

China Plate has continued to employ alumni as associate producers, and project consultants, supporting their professional development and development of new work.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The cost of The Optimists will factor in:

- China Plate planning and delivery time (two facilitators usually provided per session)
- External guest speaker costs

How much this will be is dependent on the length of the programme (usually 10 sessions), location (whether online/face to face/hybrid) and number of guest speakers.

It is anticipated that costs associated with participants (marketing/access requirements) will be sourced separately by the partner organisation.
